It feels a bit like that in church this year as we are already moving into Lent with Christmas just a few weeks ago!

Lent, like Advent, is one of my favourite seasons in the church year. I like it because Lent gives us an opportunity to stop, even if it's just for a moment, to wonder about what is going to happen and what it all means.

Looking forward to something, considering where we are and what Easter will mean to us this year, is a rich and rewarding thing to do because Easter is never the same twice.

As we change, so Easter changes for us.

That's made even more apparent as Easter is a 'moveable feast'. The date is not set. It moves around with the cycles of the moon so that it is always at the same time as the ancient Jewish celebration of Passover, remembering when the Hebrew slaves escaped from Egypt the night the angel of death passed over those who had painted the blood of a lamb on their doorposts.

Easter can be a time of great celebration, with the hosannas of Palm Sunday and the joyful alleluias of Easter Day when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Holy week, the days between these two Sundays, offers us a very different experience as we journey with Jesus through the week of Passover where he will speak of what is to come, break bread for the last time with his friends and show and tell them how he wants them to live. It can be a difficult road to travel, but one that can be incredibly rewarding.

I hope that however you journey through Lent that when Easter Day dawns you will feel the blessing of God.

#### **Spring Clean**

As we move into spring, I'm sure I am not alone in turning my thoughts to the mammoth job of spring cleaning ahead. After several months of hibernating, the milder weather is motivation in itself to get back to work and have a good clear out. But perhaps our homes are not the only thing that could do with a tidy up.

There is an episode that particularly stands out for me in *Little Men* by Louisa M. Alcott, in which a young boy, Demi, shares his approach to tackling sin with an older, wilder boy called Dan. Demi describes his mind as being the room his soul inhabits. The room is filled with drawers where he keeps his goodness and badness. Demi recognises that on a regular basis he needs to put the room in order, filling the drawers with lovely things, and locking away the naughty things. He knows just how hard this is, and looks to his grandfather for help and guidance. Dan seems quietly in awe of the younger boy's earnestness, responding wistfully, "I don't think there is a lock strong enough to keep my badness shut up. Anyway, my room is in such a clutter I don't know how to clear it up."

How I can identify with this image! It is very hard to break free from the clutter that accumulates, both physically and metaphorically in our lives. No room stays tidy on its own, but if we take the time to have a good clear out and get rid of the rubbish every so often, then we can keep it in relatively good order. The same applies to our lives. In Little Men, Dan has a particular problem with swearing. It is the habit of many, and has almost become socially acceptable in this day and age. With bad language used so casually on the television and in the public, we hear it on a day to day basis, making it a very difficult habit to break free from. There are many other bad habits that are just as difficult to give up. In the Bible, the book of James tells us to "get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent, and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you" (1.21). That is why we need to have a good spring clean routinely




#### **Used Stamps**

#### **Leprosy Mission Update**

I would like to give a big thank you to everyone who has contributed over the last few months for the Leprosy Mission. At the beginning of the week Jim took a very heavy bag containing lots and lots of coins (too heavy for me to carry) and banknotes to the bank and put it in the church account. Our treasurer Bill Storrie will forward it electronically to the Leprosy Mission Offices in Stirling. The amount we had collected was £261 and thanks again to everyone who helped. Some people use their collection boxes and others give a donation when it's mentioned in the church intimations. I have asked the Stirling Office to send me another six boxes, so if you would like to take part just ask me for one of them.

I would like to share with you some of the information given at the front of the ASK 2020 Prayer Diary which I received from the Leprosy Mission.

"Every twenty minutes a child somewhere in the world is diagnosed with leprosy. It is heart breaking to see children affected by this ancient disease, and a tragedy that this is still happening today. It is also why the Leprosy Mission is prioritising stopping leprosy transmission by 2035 so that we don't see child cases of leprosy in the future.

Last year, The Leprosy Mission Global Fellowship adopted a new Global Strategy for 2019-23. Part of this new strategy talks about us being a Christ-centred organisation, following Jesus Christ to bring about transformation, by breaking the chains of this ancient disease, and empowering people to attain healing, dignity and life in all its fullness."

There are usually copies of any leaflets and newsletters I receive from the Leprosy Mission on the table in the vestibule, so please help yourself to one when you are passing. Thanks again to everyone.

#### **Anne Cowan**



It's been a year since Trust Jack Foundation opened its doors to the community of Stonehouse and what a year it has been. We started off with three groups: an art therapy group, a men only support group and a mixed male and female support group which were all aimed at people with mental health illnesses. We also have been providing 1 to 1 therapy to children and young adults.

Now we have 24 passionate volunteers to help and support others and also fundraise to keep our doors open and our services running. Without our volunteers we could never do what we do. Along the way we have had a great deal of fun and enjoyment out of seeing people break down barriers to help them move forward with their lives. We have also enjoyed becoming a part of the community and providing activities to young people and bringing families together.

Our services have grown over the year as and we have tried to include people of all ages. We now have a youth club called 'The Hub Club'. This is our P1 to P7 group and will be adding an S1+ in August 2020 for P7s that want to continue coming to our group. Last year we provided a Summer Programme for the children during the school holidays which included trips and activities around Stonehouse. At Christmas time we were able to take the children to a panto and have a Christmas party, Santa paid us a visit and all the children were given a gift. We were only able to do this due to a donation given to us by Stonehouse Masonic Lodge.

We have our Knit n Natter group, a knitting and crochet group which is open to anyone from beginner to expert. The group has provided neonatal hats for 3 hospitals and currently knitting outfits for new-borns in Malawi that have no clothes when they are born and are simply wrapped up in newspaper. They have also provided items for the community including the lovely hearts for the World Prevention of Suicide Day last September and Christmas tree decoration that were put out over Stonehouse just before Christmas last year.

We also go out to schools, nurseries, and youth groups including Girls Brigade and football teams to raise awareness of mental health and mental health ill-health discussing what they feel like, what to do when they feel this way and who to talk. We deliver the first step suicide prevention training, SafeTALK, free of charge for people over the age of 15 years.



We created two counselling rooms in Jack's Hub to provide Talking Therapy. They are also used as a safe space for people to go if they are struggling with anxiety or if their mind is racing and just need space away from other people. Our new group is called 'Doon Memory Lane' which is on the first Wednesday of the month from 12.30 to 2.30pm and each time there is a different theme.

As you can see we have been very busy over our first year finding our place within our community. Even though we support and help people from all over Lanarkshire, Stonehouse is our home and we love making a contribution. We are not only here to support people with mental health issues, our aim is to bring our community together, talk to each other, meet new people, prevent loneliness, and create a place that's safe to talk about issues.

We have been overwhelmed by the support we have been given not only by the Stonehouse community but by organisations within the village and this is something we can't thank you all enough for.


