Paul's message

In finding a way forward as a congregation

we have held 3 open meetings from November through to February were we listened for God's voice. The place where we sought to hear God's voice was in the bible: through Scripture. We split into 3 or 4 separate groups and each group looked at three categories: what did Jesus say, where did Jesus go, what did Jesus do. We then looked for repetitions of what came to mind in each group and allowed that to be God's speaking to us about what to take note of: (the figures in brackets below indicate how many groups chose the same biblical text. We then consider that to be what God wants us to hear at this time.)

The lists are made up of which places, things Jesus said, things Jesus did, were chosen by groups. **It is this** means what is written below are the places and things God wants us to note at this time in our congregational life. The list on the right hand side is what these things in the bible point towards in how we live together as a church and who we shall become.

Translating our listening into being and doing

Who are we going to be and what are we going to do?

Having gone through this exercise what I hope is becoming clear is that being church is nothing less than a continuation of Jesus' life, death and resurrection here and now. Church doesn't do something separate from what Jesus did, instead we keep faith with it and live it out in this time and place among the people of this village.

So after this listening process who are we to be?

Those who live out the good news of God's salvation in Jesus:

- * In the power of prayer and contemplation
- * Partnering God's mission and bringing the good news to the village
- * By our worship and seeking Justice for those harmed or overlooked
- * Alongside those who suffer
- * Through the hospitality we generously offer
- * Helping to mend the wounded
- * Helping transformation happen
- * Bringing trust that God is working in and with us and we have permission to take risks in that
- * Living out a new life in Christ
- * Doing ordinary things with tenderness; giving and receiving forgiveness
- * Valuing and nurturing our children
- * Learning together to be followers of the way
- * Being a community that brings the healing of God

This is who we are.

Starting point:

We are beginning to recover a pattern of ministry that allows for the full inclusion of the congregation. The worship, ministry and mission of St Ninian's is returning to the principle that in partnership with God, church is about the work of the people for the sake of the common good. This presumes that people are called by God to partner God in a specific time, at a specific place among a specific group of people. This also presumes that God is at work

in and through who we are equipping us with the gifts needed to take our part in that partnership.

The question is then:

How do we begin to give practical shape to who we are i.e. how do we turn who we are (list above) into what we do? The conclusion we came to was that we seek out the gifts God has placed in the human beings who make up St Ninian's. What do you like to do? What gives you life, what are you good at – these are questions we are asking to guide our participation in being the church for this time, place and people.



Dear Friends,

As I write this at the end of January, a few bulbs and snowdrops are peeking through the snow in my garden, heralding a new Spring and new beginnings.

We start a new year in Church life too and I am pleased to report that we are in a healthier position financially than we were at this time last year. This is in no small measure due to the generosity of our Congregation. However we cannot, and must not, become complacent. We must make savings as and where we can.

Again, we have been fortunate to be able to reclaim substantial amounts of tax from HMRC through Gift Aid and I would urge anyone not currently giving through Gift Aid, to consider doing so.

I hope you did not have much damage during the gales. Sadly I cannot say the same about our Church which suffered damage to the roof and for which we have just had an estimate of £7500 for repairs.

We also have begun a programme for repairs, replacements and decoration of the Manse – work which is long overdue – to bring this up to the required standard.

So, as always, there is a huge demand on the resources we have and the Finance Team hope that, with your continued support, we will be able to meet our obligations during the year.
