Trees, lights, candles and tinsel.

I love Christmas. It's the most hygge time of the year.

Hygge (pronounced hue-guh) is a Danish word used when acknowledging a feeling or moment, whether alone or with friends, at home or out, ordinary or extraordinary as cosy, charming or special. We discovered it when Dr Jack Dyce came to help us think about what the Nordic world could teach us about being church and being a community together.

Carols & Candles, where we help the community of Stonehouse come together to switch on the Christmas lights, is a very hygge event, as is Night Church, with the dark church lit by candles and soft lights and the Christian Aid Sing A Song for Christmas where we join together to sing and have fun and give much needed help to those around the world who most need it.

We often think of the stable where Jesus was born as being hygge; the warm glow of candles and starlight with the animals gathered around the manger with Mary and Joseph. It's a scene that has featured on millions of Christmas cards and even on the front of this edition of the LINK Magazine. It's an image that invites us into a warm and loving family scene. But when we take a step back from that cosy picture and think about our own experience of animals and stables and childbirth it all gets a lot less cosy and a bit more risky and smelly and frightening.

Jesus was born in what we could only charitably describe as 'temporary accommodation' in a country occupied by a military superpower, the Romans. Soon after his birth he and his family had to run away to Egypt to escape the murderous King Herod. Jesus and his family spent the first years of his life as a refugee, an asylum seeker. That's something we should seriously reflect on in our current political and social climate. We have just commemorated the 100th anniversary of the end of The Great War. It was the war that was meant to end all wars. Of course it didn't, and soon the rise of prejudice and fear led to division and more war. We must learn the lessons of history or risk falling headlong into making the same tragic mistakes again.

Each time Christmas comes around I find the idea that God would want to enter into the mess and chaos of human life more and more astonishing... and I'm more and more grateful that He did because for most of us life isn't always straightforward. It has its ups and downs, those highs and lows that make up all of our lives.

As I look forward to my second Christmas here in Stonehouse I'm grateful to feel a welcomed part of this community. It's a privilege to journey with you through life and to be invited to spend moments with you at some of the most difficult and the most joyful times.

Our theme this year has been 'Living Well Together'. Providing some space for those who find Christmas more difficult due to loss or bereavement is important, so I'd like to invite you to our Light in the Darkness service at 3pm on the 9th of December. Please invite your family, friends and neighbours if you think this service could offer some comfort and support to them.

Being able to celebrate Christmas at our range of services and events throughout December is a wonderful gift and I hope you will join us. (There's a list of everything happening in the centre pages)

From Santa's Grotto at our Christmas Cafe, Night Church, the Nativity Service, Light in the Darkness, Santa's Bedtime Story or the Family Service and Watchnight on Christmas Eve, there's something for everyone at St Ninian's this Christmas. We've even been able to create more wheelchair spaces and an area of more comfortable seating for those who can't manage the pews!

But more than all of that, the gift of 'God with us' is something that I hope you will be able to take some time to reflect on and find hope in.

I wish you a peaceful Christmas and blessing for the New Year.

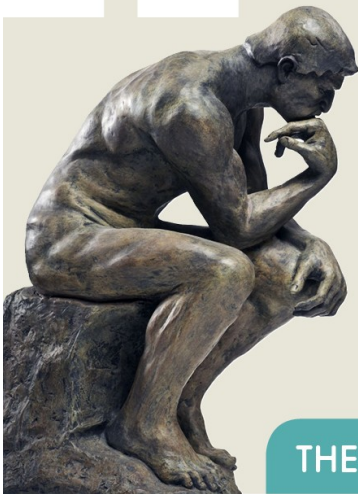

Pondering it Over

Waiting for a baby is a time of great preparation, anxiety and anticipation, with so much to think about and so much to put into place. But generally it is considered a very special time for the parents to be, specially the first time round. We all know the Christmas story well, but we can't begin to imagine what it must have been like for Mary and Joseph, expecting their first baby in very extraordinary circumstances.

Whenever I reread the story of Jesus' birth, as told in the gospel of Luke, there is one verse that particularly stands out for me as a mother. Following a visit from the shepherds, very soon after the baby's birth, Luke 2.19 says, 'But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.' This is such a timeless statement, and one that I think any mother can relate to. It is only natural to hold dear the special things people say about a new baby in the family.

Indeed all sorts of things were said about Jesus, and some of them a very long time before his birth, which was foretold by the prophets. Advent is a good time to reflect on these, as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Saviour. I

Isaiah 9.6 tells us, *'For to us a child is born... And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace'.*

Micah 5.2 says, *'But you, Bethlehem... though you are small... out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel'. Even before Jesus' conception, Mary was told by an angel that "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High... He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; his kingdom will never end" (Luke 1.32-33).*

It is common these days for mothers to keep a record or diary throughout the pregnancy and first year of their baby's life. I wonder at the sorts of things Mary could have put in hers, had there been an equivalent two millennia ago. There was the angel's visit, when she surrendered to God's will. Then there was her time communing with her cousin Elizabeth, who was also expecting a miracle baby.

This was followed by a long and exhausting journey to Bethlehem, and then the birth itself in squalid conditions. How could she forget the baby's first visitors, shepherds who declared they had heard the news of the birth from angels. And later, the Magi, who foresaw Jesus' birth and followed his star, perhaps for years, so they could worship him. Mary certainly had some astonishing experiences during her pregnancy and afterwards. But then, Jesus was no ordinary baby.

We too can ponder, like Mary, over the coming of Jesus, as we revisit the nativity story this Christmas, holding dear the significance of the event, and the peace and joy it brings into our lives.

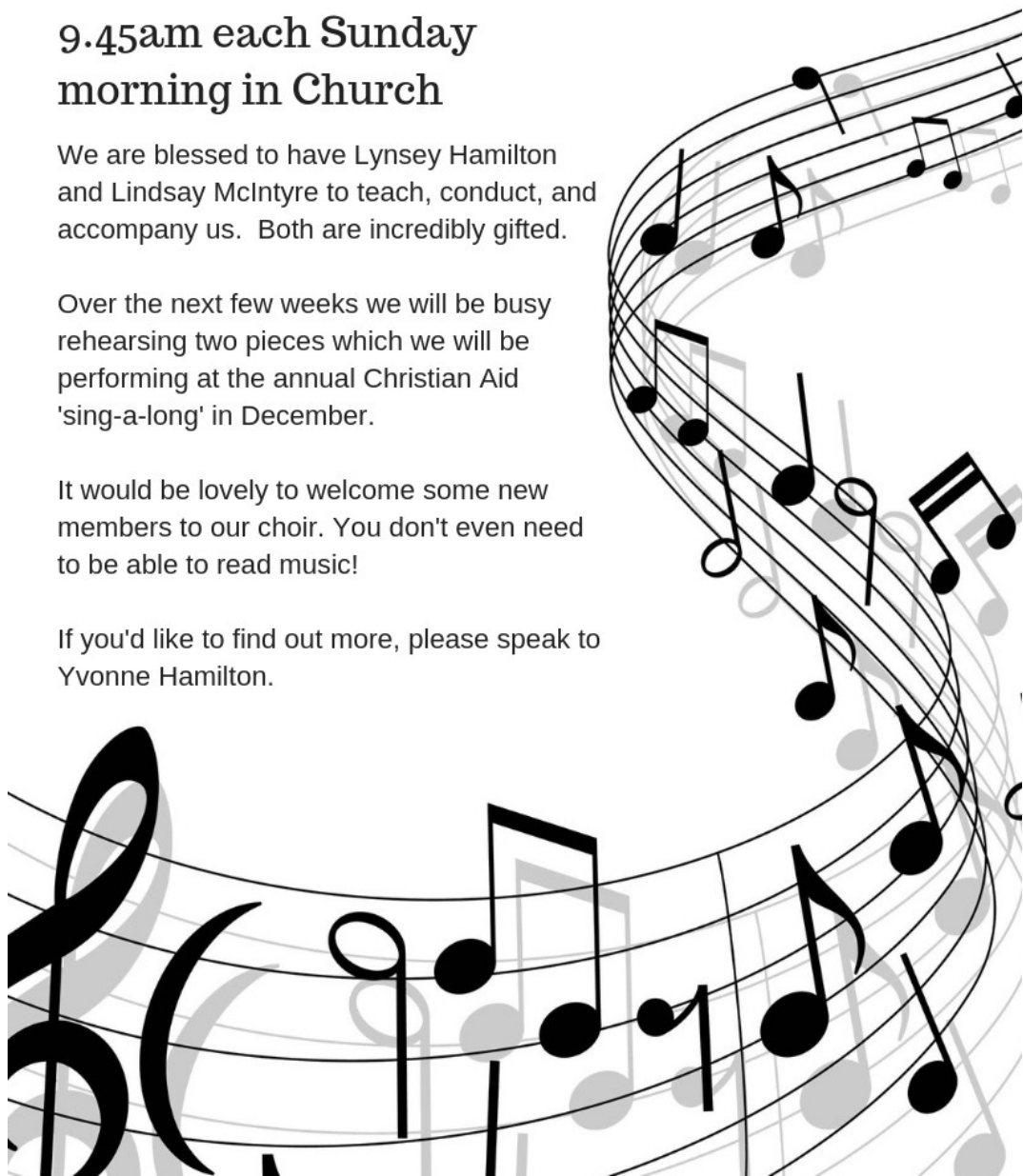

Through both the Finance Committee and The Board I have been voicing my concerns regarding our precarious financial position over the past few months. As we approach the end of 2018 I think it is fair to say that we will be struggling to fulfil our Ministries & Mission obligations, specifically to URC Synod. Costs continue to increase within a falling revenue environment. Given current trends I do not see this changing anytime soon. Thought has to be given as to how we can increase revenue.

Our day to day expenses exceed our income by just over £11,000 and that does not include the fact that our Ministries & Mission payments are behind. A sobering thought as we head towards the end of the year. Hopefully our fund raising efforts over the next two months will see us through but we do need to consider this position urgently as we move forward... our Church is financially under pressure!!!

Please consider how you might be able to help through increased giving, supporting fundraising or setting up a monthly standing order.

I am pleased to say that, with the assistance of the *Coffee Morning Ladies*, we are enjoying the benefits provided by our new windows. They not only look great but they are also keeping in the heat, something which again will benefit us in the future. Safe to say, given my comments above, any further building work will need to be met through grant application as every other penny must be routed via the main account for the time being.

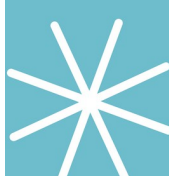

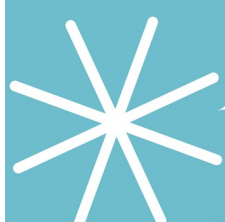

We hope to offer similar opportunities to the wider community as well as having lots of other ideas for 2019!

Greetings from Uganda

Our Fourth Month

October has been a busy month for us. The work here at the centre has continued, with Sarah-Jane involved in assessing new children as well as those children who have been struggling to attend the centre.

We have also initiated a key-working scheme to try to ensure that all children have a key worker who is able to take a special interest in their well-being and development. We have set up a daily enrichment program for the centre children so that those who do not take part in the vocational activities in the afternoon can take part in other activities such as crafts, games, music etc. These have been a great success!



Our own children are becoming more settled every month and are learning more Luganda phrases. It is a great joy to see them playing and being friends with children with disabilities.

They have the ability to just accept the other children exactly as they are. We have made friends with another Muzungu (white) family in Kampala who also have 3 children and in the middle of October we were able to spend a couple of days with them in a local hotel. This was great and we all enjoyed having a few days to relax, swim and play some games.

Although Kampala is only around 40km away, it is a 2-hour journey on a packed local bus to get there. We have become experts at sitting on 3 seats between us! It's not a journey you want to undertake if your stomach is not feeling quite right! This month we have all remained well and we are thankful for that. We continue to enjoy the warm sunshine every day especially when seeing the overnight Autumn temperatures in Scotland...
